One Thirty Productions, in Cooperation with the Bath House Cultural Center, Opens its Tenth Season with *Grace and Glorie*, March 8-25, 2017

DALLAS- One Thirty Productions in cooperation with the Bath House Cultural Center and the City of Dallas Office of Cultural Affairs proudly announces the opening of the delightful play Grace and Glorie by Tom Zeigler on March 8th. Grace and Glorie was first produced by the company in 2010 and was the audience choice to kick of the One Thirty's tenth anniversary season.

Grace and Glorie is the heartwarming story of two women from very different worlds. Between an illiterate old woman fresh home from the hospital and an urbane Harvard educated MBA volunteering for hospice, which do you think needs saving? Cultures and generations hilariously collide when an illiterate but savvy cantankerous old mountain woman plans to live out her life high in the Blue Ridge Mountains in the little cabin she calls home. The old stove smokes, there is no phone, and there are chickens on the front porch. She is visited by the Harvard-educated transplanted New Yorker who is assigned as her hospice volunteer.

Grace and Glorie ran Off Broadway and starred Estelle Parsons and Lucy Arnaz. Marty Van Kleeck will direct the production, which will star Gene Ray Price and Desire Fultz in the title roles. Ms. Price is a longtime audience favorite, while Desiree is making her first appearance with One Thirty Productions. Grace and Glorie is a very funny and touching piece, full of revelation and hope: it's no wonder this charming piece was selected as a Hallmark Hall of Fame movie of the week.

This matinee series was designed for the theater patron who enjoys an afternoon performance, light comedies or plays that are "old fashioned" in the sense that they tell a good story and are filled with unforgettable characters. In addition to enjoying quality live theater in the beautiful setting of White Rock Lake, patrons can take a leisurely stroll through the art galleries at the Bath House, and be home long before the late afternoon traffic.

Grace and Glorie opens March 8th and runs through March 25th. Performances are 1:30 P.M. at the Bath House Cultural Center on White Rock Lake. Shows are scheduled Wednesday-Saturday.
