## One Thirty Productions opens Eleventh Season with English Comedy

One Thirty Productions, in cooperation with the City Dallas Office of Cultural Affairs, opens its eleventh season at the Bath House Cultural Center with an area premiere of Peter Quilter’s charming comedy, “The Nightingales.” It is the 1950s and Beatrice and Charlie Nightingale, old Music Hall stars, full of hilarious tales of life on the road, have retired and are in need of a change of scene. Jack, their son, a very successful cabaret star, is more than a little surprised when they show up at his front door one morning with their old touring truck and many suitcases. They promise to be gone by Christmas, but this is little comfort to Jack and his cabaret partner, Maggie, since it is only January seventh. Jack’s housekeeper, Geraldine copes masterfully with the ensuing chaos. “The Nightingales” is an effervescent, witty comedy with a happy ending that pulls out all the stops.

Bruce Coleman directs a cast of Dallas favorites including David Meglino, Mary-Margaret Pyeatt, John Davies, Marty Van Kleeck and Gene Raye Price. Rodney Dobbs is set designer; Marco Salinas designs the sound, and Stewart Mikkelsen is lighting designer.

“The Nightingales” opens on March 7 and runs through March 24, 2018. Performances are at 1:30 PM, Wednesday through Saturday, with an additional performance on Tuesday, March 20. All performances are at the Bath House Cultural Center, 521 East Lawther Dr., Dallas, TX 75218.
